



Pupil Premium Action Plan 2018-19

Some key information about disadvantaged learners at BCHS - tbc

- 1. There are 233 learners in school and 17 students in College who are on the Pupil Premium register
- 2. The proportion of PP learners in school is currently 27.4% (@8.2.18)
- 3. There are 8 Children in Care in school
- 4. The Pupil Premium budget for 2018-2019 is £230, 100 which includes £12,000 of Year 7 Catch-Up funding
- 5. Assistant Headteacher (Jacqui Jenkinson) with direct responsibility for leading strategies to support disadvantaged learners and measuring impact
- 6. The interventions used in school specifically for PP learners are varied and are grouped into the following 4 Key Objectives
